


- Between major and minor ports, 984.44 MMT of traffic saw movement in Apr'23-Feb'24 which was an increase of 9.16% as compared to the same period last fiscal. 87.24 MMT of traffic was maintained in Feb'24 which showed an increase of 9.07% as compared to Feb'23.
- Major ports reported volume growth of 4.60% to 433.51 MMT in Apr'23-Feb'24, as compared to total volume of 413.58 MMT during same period last year. In the month of Feb'24, the traffic was recorded at 38.59 MMT which was an increase by 3.08% compared to Feb'23.
- Traffic wise Paradip, Visakhapatnam & Kandla showed the highest traffic at 130.37 MMT, 63.66 MMT, 47.58 MMT respectively.



BULK CARGO

- India's coal production increased by 7.79% to 12.39 MMT from 11.42 MMT during Feb'24 as compared to Feb'23.
- Coal traffic on Major Indian ports stood at 144.25 MMT in April'23-Feb'24.
- Shipments of ore, including pellets through the 12 major ports, increased by 32.58% Y-O-Y to 47.73 MMT in April'23-Feb'24 as compared to April'22-Feb'23.




LIQUID CARGO

KEY POINTS MINOR PORTS


- Minor ports reported volume increase of 12.76% to 550.93 MMT in Apr'23-Feb'24, as compared to total volume of 480.64 MMT during same period last year. In Feb'24, the total reported volume was 48.65 MMT which showed an increase of 13.83% Y-O-Y.
- Traffic wise top three ports Sikka, Mundra & Krishnapatnam showed traffic of 118.01 MMT, 64.41 MMT & 52.51 MMT resp.




CARGO PERFORMANCE MINOR PORTS

BULK CARGO

- Coal shipment at Indian minor ports during Apr'23-Feb'24 increased nearly 22.89% to 187.78 MMT from 144.79 MMT for the same period last year.
- There was significant increase of 49.48% in the shipment of ore from 42.02 MMT in Apr'22-Feb'23 to 21.23 MMT in Apr'23-Feb'24.
- Total Bulk Cargo traffic at minor ports increased nearly 20.90% to 294.95 MMT from 233.32 MMT for the same period last year.





LIQUID CARGO

- Crude oil, POL & LPG/LNG shipments at Indian minor ports was recorded at 227.87 MMT and other Liquids traffic at major port rose to 21.44 MMT in Apr'23-Feb'24.
- Total Liquid Cargo traffic at minor ports increased during Apr'23-Feb'24 by 4.26% to 249.31 MMT from 238.68 MMT for the same period last year.

JNPA celebrates historic milestone, marks safe arrival of M.T. Bharat at its Liquid Berth Terminal.

Jawaharlal Nehru Port Authority (JNPA) which operates as a 100% landlord port is elated to announce a momentous achievement as the chemical tanker M.T. Bharat, laden with precious cargo of Edible Oil, safely docked at JNPA's newly inaugurated additional Liquid Berth Terminal LB3 at 10.30 am. The vessel was welcomed by esteemed JNPA officials, marking a significant milestone in the port's illustrious history. The welcome ceremony was graced by esteemed officials from JNPA along with distinguished representatives from BPCL and the vessel master, Igor Ignatiev. This momentous occasion celebrates not only the successful arrival of M.T. Bharat but also the collaborative efforts of all stakeholders involved. M.T. Bharat stands out amongst its peers with its impressive dimensions, boasting an overall length (LOA) of 176 meters, a width of 31 meters, and a draft of 11.1 meters. Flying the Panama flag proudly, this chemical tanker signifies the epitome of efficiency and excellence in maritime transportation. A special commendation goes out to the dedicated Marine Team whose relentless efforts and expertise played a pivotal role in turning this milestone into a reality. Port JSW Infrastructure incorporates arm to execute projects at JNPT.

- JSW Infrastructure incorporates JSW JNPT Liquid Terminal Pvt Ltd in Mumbai for a port project at JNPT, Maharashtra. The subsidiary received a Letter of Intent for equipping, operation, maintenance, and transfer of liquid cargo berths LB3 and LB4. The LoI requires the incorporation of a special purpose vehicle within 30 days to fulfil the stated obligations.
- JSW Infrastructure on Wednesday said it has incorporated a wholly-owned subsidiary for the execution of a port project at JNPT in Maharashtra. JSW JNPT Liquid Terminal Pvt Ltd has been incorporated on March 13, in Mumbai, according to a regulatory filing. The company said it has received a Letter of Intent (LoI) from Jawaharlal Nehru Port Authority for equipping, operation, maintenance and transfer of additional liquid cargo berths LB3 and LB4 at the port. The terms of LoI require the incorporation of a special purpose vehicle to enter into a concession agreement within 30 days of the issue of LoI. "Accordingly, the company has incorporated a new entity for the purpose of entering into the said concession agreement and to fulfil the obligations as stated in the said agreement," JSW Infrastructure said.

20% spike noted in cargo movement at Mormugao port.

In encouraging news for the Mormugao Port Authority, the Port Authority, the port witnessed the fastest growth in cargo movement among all major ports in the country in 2023-24. The port has also seen a slight increase in cruise passenger arrivals this year, at one point handling three cruise vessels on the same day. The increase in business bodes well for the financially weak port, which depends on export and import cargo for its survival. "Last year (2022-23), the port handled around 17.3 million tonnes and this year (2023-24) the port crossed 19.5 million tonnes, and we will be touching around 21 million tonnes this year, which is a 20% growth over the last year," said MPA chairman N Vinod Kumar at CII's annual meet. Kumar said that this is the highest growth among the 12 major ports in India. This, however, is because of the port's low base. The port, which was founded in 1885, used to handle more than 50 million tonnes in a year when iron ore mining was at its peak. In the absence of iron ore mining, the port has shifted to coal import and export of iron ore, steel, molasses, and other general cargo. The port also handles petroleum products and other liquid cargo. Kumar has another reason to be optimistic. He expects the harbour mobile cranes to be commissioned and ready for operations by Aug-Sep, which will enable the port to handle container cargo. The cruise sector has also seen steady recovery since the pandemic, and the port has seen more vessels docking at the port. He said that the real benefit of the cruise industry would come when Goa is designated as a home port by international and domestic cruise lines. Source: Times of India
